Enhancements to Greyhound Owners & Breeders Incentive Scheme (GOBIS)

A joint initiative of the Victorian Coalition Government and Greyhound Racing Victoria

Victorian Greyhound Industry

- The Greyhound racing and breeding industry provides economic benefits to Victoria of \$200 million and close to 2,000 jobs.
- There are 13 greyhound racing tracks across the State.
- Approximately 3,000 trainers (full time, part time and hobby), more than 10,000 owners (large majority outside of Melbourne), approximately 700 breeders.

GOBIS Background

- GOBIS was a joint initiative of the Victorian Government, GRV and the Greyhound Owners Trainers & Breeders Association (GOTBA) which started in 1994.
- The objective of GOBIS is to support and promote the Victorian greyhound breeding industry and to provide bonuses and incentives to the owners and breeders of qualified Victorian bred greyhounds.
- To be nominated for registration under the Scheme a greyhound must be whelped in Victoria.
- GRV schedules more than 740 GOBIS races each year across the State with bonuses totalling \$900,000
- Current GOBIS nomination fee: \$43 (if paid before dog reaches 9 months) or \$130 (if older than 9 months).
- Current bonuses: \$2,400 to connections for a metropolitan win; \$1,000 to connections for a country win.
- Payment of bonus:
 - If the Breeder is the Nominator, 50% of the bonus applicable to the winning greyhound shall be paid to the Breeder, and the other 50% shall be paid to the Owner.
 - If the Owner is the Nominator, 75% of the bonus applicable to the winning greyhound shall be paid to the Owner, and the other 25% shall be paid to the Breeder.

New GOBIS Bonuses

 Enhanced GOBIS scheme to commence from 1 April 2012 with three new initiatives:

• A \$500 Metro GOBIS Bonus for the winners of ALL races at main metropolitan meetings

 GOBIS registered winners of ALL races at each of the two main metropolitan meetings (The Meadows on Saturday nights and Sandown on Thursday nights) will receive a \$500 bonus. This bonus is in addition to any existing GOBIS bonus on scheduled main metropolitan races.

• A \$10,000 Group GOBIS Bonus for the winners of all Victorian Group races

 GOBIS registered winners of the 32 Group races (includes all Country Cups and selected Metropolitan races) will receive a \$10,000 bonus.

• 50% GOBIS bonus if first placed greyhound is not GOBIS registered (for all 740 scheduled GOBIS races)

- If the winning greyhound of one of the scheduled GOBIS bonus races (currently about 740 scheduled) is not GOBIS registered, then 50% of the allocated bonus will be paid to the first placed (2nd or 3rd) GOBIS registered greyhound.
- No bonus will be paid if there are no GOBIS registered greyhounds in the first three placegetters.
- The 50% of bonus payment will also apply to the new \$500 metro bonus and the \$10,000 Group bonus.

Enhanced GOBIS Scheme – Bonus payments		
Race Type	GOBIS registered winner	First placegetter (2 nd or 3 rd) if winner is not GOBIS registered
Group Race Metro & Country	\$10,000 (new Group GOBIS bonus)	\$5,000 (50% of new Group GOBIS bonus)
Main metro GOBIS race	\$2,900 = \$500 (new Metro GOBIS bonus) + \$2,400 (existing GOBIS Bonus)	\$1,450 = \$250 (50% of new Metro GOBIS bonus) + \$1200 (new 50% of existing GOBIS Bonus)
Main metro non-GOBIS race	\$500 (new Metro GOBIS bonus)	\$250 (50% of new Metro GOBIS bonus)
Country GOBIS race	\$1,000 (existing GOBIS Bonus)	\$500 (new 50% of existing GOBIS Bonus)

Greyhound Ready to Run Auction Series

- A 'Ready to Run' annual auction is to be established to (a) promote the sale of Victorian bred greyhounds and (b) encourage syndication.
- The Ready to Race Auctions will create a much easier pathway to enter the sport.
 Potential owners will be able to watch greyhounds trial before making an offer. This will drastically cut the waiting period between purchasing a greyhound and the time that greyhound races from about eighteen months to just a matter of months.
- The auction is broadly based on the successful bi-annual concept held in USA for un-raced pups. The concept sees greyhounds, between the ages of 13 and 18 months, race publicly prior to the auction.
- GRV, in consultation with the industry, will determine a location for the first auction and appropriate distances for the races prior to auction.
- Special consideration to participate will be given to GOBIS registered and/or eligible greyhounds.

Funding Details

The total cost of the new GOBIS program over the next four years will be \$2.8 million (with Government providing VRIF funds of \$1.55million and GRV \$1.25million)
