AustralianRacingGreyhound.com has a very loyal readership with over 40,000 unique visitors every month, who are very focused on greyhound racing and its products.




Australian Racing Greyhound Stats





Britton labels Code of Practice a "disgrace"

LEADING Victorian conditioner Rob Britton has labelled the draft Code of Practice for the Keeping of Racing Greyhounds as a "disgrace"

The code was recently released by the Victorian Government's Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources and was formulated as a response to the 2015 reports by Sal Perna and Dr. Charles Milne.

The code covers a wide range of issues/
a> facing the industry such as the management of greyhounds throughout their entire lifecycle and minimum standards expected from participants encompassing housing, socialisation and mental stimulation.

Britton said certain aspects of the code could spell the end for many participants within the industry if implemented, including new standards for kennels, yards and fencing. "There should be a grandfather clause in there regarding these new standards which should specify that properties should be brought up to standard as participants have to replace and repair – otherwise having to bring everything to comply with these standards at once will send people broke," Britton said.

"As long as there are no welfare concerns participants shouldn't have to re-invent the wheel and fix what hasn't been broken for years."

Britton also felt most of the industry's feedback had not been considered when writing the code.

"I attended number of industry workshops and spoke to the department of agriculture – many of the parts of the code were brought up then and we gave reasons why they shouldn't be implemented – but it just seems like they have ignored our input. "Most of these points are ideology rather than practical business sense and if allowed to go ahead in the current form the industry is going to crumble.

"There are a lot of little things in there that shouldn't be there such as the size of the dog determining the size of the kennel needed.

"Also the staffing issue is totally unnecessary – we have surveillance systems in place here and we live on the property so we are here most of the time – but on occasion we go to the dogs together, to the shops – but reading this report we will have to have someone here all the time. "Then you read that people with more than two dogs are going to be considered professional trainers – it's out of control. "I tried explaining this to them, but they obviously had their ideas on what was going to be in there."





Britton labels Code of Practice a "disgrace"

It's noteworthy that since the turn of the century the Queensland all-distance champion Cyndie's Magic is the only greyhound which has managed to make the same major distance race final for three successive years.

in 2015 Cyndies Magic Inistined sixth behind Dzecko. She then finished a solid second behind My Boy Brodie in 2016, beaten just three-quarters of a length. In Thursday night's Albion Park Gold Cup final Cyndie's Magic snatched third place right on the line after coming from a long last early, well beaten but courageous to

Fanta Bale.
It's worthy of mention that across the history of Australian racing, only six 'halfmilers' have made the same major race
final for three consecutive years.
Often described as the greatest

Often deserved rated as the greatest string of performances in a major race anywhere in the world, the effort of the great stayer Bold Trease to annex four successive Sandown Cup's is a feat unlikely ever to be matched.

Yet those four consecutive Sandown Cup wins, achieved in 1986, 1987, 1988 and 1989, have overshadowed another series of remarkable efforts achieved by the Hall of Fame inductee during his long and illustrious career.

Prior to scoring his first victory in the Sandown Cup, Bold Trease had scored a narrow win in the Victorian final of the National Distance Championship, defeating the smart Club Stroller by a head, at Sandown. This propelled him into the National Distance Championship final, run that year over 70 metres at the Gabba, A year later, Bold Trease made the Victorian final yet again (that year run at Olym pic Park over 732 metres), but was beate just over half a length into third place b Mystic Hope.

Then, in 1988, Bold Trease made it into the Victorian final for a third successive time, becoming the first and only greyhound to achieve this feat. This time he again finished third, behind his great rival High Intensity, who went on to take the National Distance Championship final, run at

Bold Trease made the final of the Sir Joh Dillon Memorial but was beaten a her by the champion Pharaoh's Mask. I made the final again in 1987 and scored brilliant three and a half lengths victor He missed the race in 1988, but in 1989 I again made the final, running a credit ble fifth behind Rules. Once again, Bo Trease is the only greyhound to have ew made three Dillon Memorial finals.

So, not only did Bold Trease win fou straight Sandown Cups, he also made th finals of two other major races on thre occasions. Just for good measure Bol Trease also made the final of anothe three major distance races twice.

While I don't have records for every major race ever contested since the start of racing behind a mechanical lure in 1927. I have found five other stayers who have made the final of the same event for three successive wars. Those five are, in chronological order or their racing careers: Michele Cherie, Mis-Coroneagh, Kirsty's Charity, Tonight's Wish and Ringside Fire.

wish and kingside Fire.

NSW stayer Michele Cherie made the final
of the Association Cup, then run over 732
metres at Harold Park, in 1977, 1978 and
1979, finishing fourth, third (beaten a half
head and a half head) and fifth.

Tasmania's champion stayer Miss Coroneagh won the Tasmanian National Distance Championship State Final in 1981 and 1982 and finished fourth in the 1983 run-off.

of the NSW National Distance Championship State Final in 1988, running last behind the smart Whip Tip, and then seventh behind Mary Casey in 1989, although she injured a shoulder in that race. Finally, in 1990, Kirsty's Charity showed just how good she was, winning the event by 12 lengths.


Tonight's Wish made the final of what is now the DDC Launching Pad but was then the Dandenong Dry Cleaners, run over 715 metres at Sandown, in 1997, 1998 and 1999. Tonight's Wish won the 1997 event, finished seventh in 1998, but bounced back to take the race again in 1999.

and 1999. Tonight's Wish finished second in 1997, scored a strong win in 1998 and ran fifth in 1999. He is therefore the only stayer other than Bold Trease to have made the final of two major distance races three years in a row.


